Not included in this summary are approximately \$1,542 in services Masonic Village at Elizabethtown contributed to the well-being of the community through benefits which are shared among Masonic Village residents and staff and members of the community, including space for support groups. Through Payment in Lieu of Taxes (PILOT) agreements for Dallas, Elizabethtown, Lafayette Hill and Sewickley, we also voluntarily paid \$2,266,266 to Luzerne, Lancaster and Allegheny counties; Dallas, West Donegal, Whitmarsh and Aleppo Townships; Elizabethtown Borough; and Dallas Area, Elizabethtown Area and Quaker Valley School Districts.
